

Both students and staff enthusiastically embrace and actively utilize and engage with the partnership project.





INGLEWOOD UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT



#### COMPLETED PROJECTS

This summer, District Maintenance staff completed the renovation work of unoccupied rooms at **Highland TK-6**, the **Child Development Center**, and **Old City Honors**. These rooms will be used to accommodate the expansion of our **Afterschool Education & Safety (ASES) programs** starting this school year. The District renovated 18 classrooms this summer for ASES.

In June, the relocation of **Inglewood Continuation High School to 155 South Kelso Street** was completed. Students attending this school will begin dasses at this new campus in August.

#### COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

The Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee met on June 1, and will meet on August 17. The Asset Management Advisory Committee met on June 29 and will meet on August 8.

#### PROJECTS UNDER CONSTRUCTION

Caroline Coleman Field: The electrical conduit for the project and future lighting and sound systems were installed in June. July activities focused on the installation of the new electronic scoreboard and site work in preparation of the new artificial turf. The new field is on schedule to be completed by the end of August, at which time home games can be hosted at the stadium. Reconstruction of the track will start after the football season and completed in early 2024.

**Electronic Marquee Project:** In late July, site work began for the installation of the new electronic marquee at **La Tijera TK-8**. The marquee is anticipated to be fully installed by the end of August.

Oak Street TK-8: The Green Space Revitalization Project is nearing completion, and additional Path of Travel work started this summer, which will be completed this month.

Contributed funds for the renovation of the Coleman Field weight room, as well as procuring the new training equipment














#### **High School E-Gaming Room**
