

- 6 comprehensive high schools, 5 alternative high schools
- This year we have 5 comprehensive high schools and one alternative high school with a Peer Advocacy class on campus



Why Peer Advocacy?




- The perfect storm of...

- Addressing the need...
 - Impact on chronic absenteeism
 - Alternatives to discipline
 - School climate and culture

- Common language through training Context-specific in practice

Our Peer Advocates program works with students and staff to create a safe school environment and culture, helping students be successful at Golden Sierra.

Peer Advocates are a group of upperclassmen that act as mentors to underclassmen students. They are there to listen to their mentees, provide support, and help connect them to community resources. In addition to their mentoring role, they also act as Teen Health Educators and facilitate communication between students, staff, and administration.



Our "Big 3" jobs:

Peer-to-Peer Support

- Available to talk to while students wait for Wellness Center support
- Available when students need to vent or be heard
- Advocating for students with teachers and administration

Connecting Students to Resources and Supports

- Wellness Center
- Golden Sierra Community Resource Center for all resources

Peer Education

- Social Emotional Learning
- Teen Health Issues

Recruitment and Training

- Sign up for the class or are nominated
- Complete an application
- Have a written recommendation from staff or current Peer Advocate
- Interview with current Peer Advocates

- Active Listening and listening non-judgmentally
- Problem-solving: brainstorming solutions
- Mental Health: anxiety, depression, substance abuse, eating disorders, stereotyping, and teen issues
- Suicide prevention

- ACEs (Adverse Childhood Experiences) and toxic stress
- Mindfulness & 123 Wellness
- Community Circles
- Restorative Justice
- Team building activities
- Improv skills for working with groups
- Building resilience and healthy life skills





Growth in El Dorado County






Mental Health Career Pathway

- Starting this school year, we have developed a Mental Health Career Pathway with Folsom Lake College




